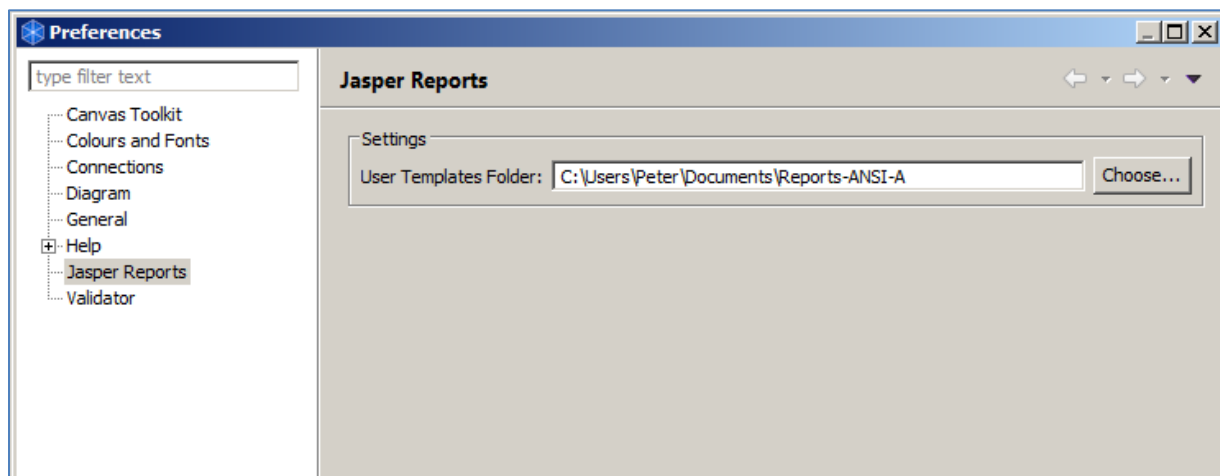


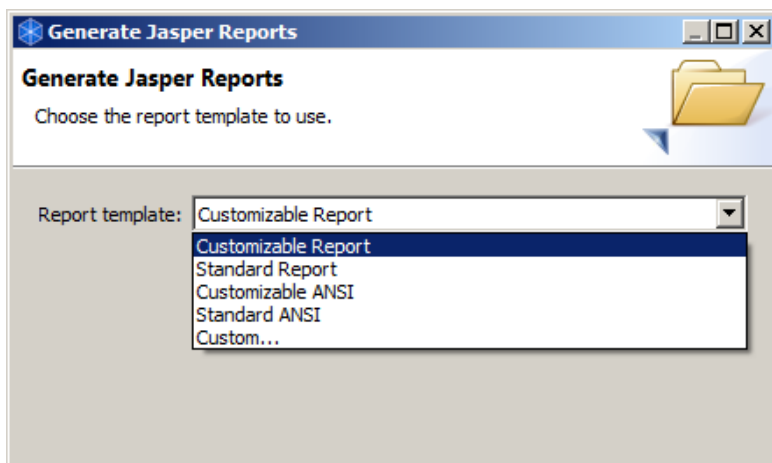
ANSI A (8.5 x 11) Report Templates - 14 June 2016

Please note that this version of the Jasper reports templates has been modified to print on ANSI A format (8.5 x 11) rather than the ISO A4 paper size. ANSI A is the most common standard used in North America. These modified templates work exactly the same as the ISO A4 reports included with Archi but take into account the slightly wider and shorter 8.5 x 11 size.

To use these templates, unzip "ANSI-reports.zip" to a folder somewhere outside of the Archi folder so it doesn't get over-written if you re-install or upgrade Archi. Then open the Archi "Preferences" dialog and enter this folder name in "User Templates Folder" in the "Jasper Reports" section as in the following example:



This will ensure that that "Standard ANSI" and "Customizable ANSI" options appear in the Report template dialog as in the following example:



The "Standard Report" and "Standard ANSI" templates will show the entire model, including all elements, relations, connectors, views, and properties. For more control over the output you can use the "Customizable Report" or "Customizable ANSI" templates. These rely on the use of specific user-defined properties to select subsets of the model and provide some control over the sort order.

The following list of user defined properties is recognized by the "Customizable Report". There are two types of properties: "model wide" or "view only". "Model wide" properties affect the whole report where "view only" properties impact only the rendering of the view having them set.

MODEL WIDE PROPERTIES

Report:Model:Hide:Business	Set the value of the property to "true" to hide the list of business concepts.
Report:Model:Hide:Application	Set the value of the property to "true" to hide the list of application concepts.
Report:Model:Hide:Technology	Set the value of the property to "true" to hide the list of technology concepts.
Report:Model:Hide:Motivation	Set the value of the property to "true" to hide the list of motivation extension concepts
Report:Model:Hide:Implementation&Migration	Set the value of the property to "true" to hide the list of implementation & migration extension concepts.
Report:Model:Hide:Connectors	Set the value of the property to "true" to hide the list of connectors.
Report:Model:Hide:Relations	Set the value of the property to "true" to hide the list of relations.
Report:Model:Hide:Views	Set the value of the property to "true" to hide the list of views.
Report:Model:Hide:ViewNumbering	Set the value of the property to "true" to hide numbering at the beginning of view name (regex <code>^[0-9.]*</code>). For example the view named "2.1.3 Org Chart" would be shown as "Org Chart". Use this if you wish to control the sort order of Views in your report.
Report:Model:Cover:Background	URL or path to an image used as the background on the cover (612 x 792). If unset a default image is used. Set it to "null" to disable it.
Report:Model:Header:Background	URL or path to an image used as the background for the page header (612 x 50). If unset then the default image is used. Set it to "null" to disable it.

VIEW ONLY PROPERTIES

Report:View:Detailed	Set the value of the property to "true" to show a detailed list of elements included in the view.
Report:View:Hide	Set the value of the property to "true" to hide the entire view.
Report:View:Hide:Diagram	Set the value of the property to "true" to hide the diagram but show the elements that are included in the view.
Report:View:Tag	Use this property to tag a view (you can use this property multiple times). Tags can then be used to create a report containing only one specific tag. To use this feature add "#tagname" to the end of the report title (case insensitive). You can make a view visible for all tags using the special tag "all".
